Electric vehicle charging stations are here



Four vehicle charging stations are ready to use for SCCOE employees only at the Ridder Park office.

They are located in the parking lot facing Brokaw Avenue, near

the library book return drop box.

The cost for charging is \$0.25/kW with a \$.50 service fee per use.

Please refer to the attached <u>flier</u> for information about how to sign up for a ChargePoint account. Once you get an account, charging is easy:

- Tap the screen with your ChargePoint card
- Pull out the charger
- Plugitin
