Re: Consolidated Categorical Apportionments for Fiscal Year 2011-12

The purpose of this e-mail is to notify you that the California Department of Education (CDE) has sent an apportionment to the State Controller's Office for payment. This apportionment, in the amount of \$106,191,358, is made from funds provided by 25 Items of the Budget Act of 2011 (Chapter 33, Statutes of 2011). These Items support 34 programs whose funding was made flexible pursuant to California Education Code (EC) Section 42605 and subject to "5-5-9" allocation pursuant to EC Section 14401.1.

Under the "5-5-9" schedule, five percent of the annual entitlement for each program is to be allocated in each of July and August and nine percent in each month thereafter through the following June.

In order to reduce the number of monthly payments a local educational agency (LEA) receives, the monthly payments for the 34 flexible categorical programs were first consolidated into one of five groups, as follows:

- #1- Student/School Access and Academic Support Programs
- #2- District and Charter School Programs
- #3- Regional Infrastructure and County Office Programs
- #4- Student Health, Safety, and Classroom/Curricular Programs
- #5- Teacher/Administrator Development and Assistance Programs

Then, these five groups were combined, creating a single payment each month for each LEA. I have attached the Schedule of the Combined Apportionment for Categorical Consolidations #1 - #5 for your information; however, you can find the document on the CDE Web page at http://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/ca/consolidations559.asp.

An apportionment schedule and letter were prepared for each of the five consolidations. I have attached these for your information; however, they are also posted on the CDE Categorical Web page at http://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/ca/consolidations559.asp. Each consolidated apportionment schedule shows the monthly payment to each LEA by program.

This apportionment, in the amount of \$61,049,737, is made from funds provided by various Items of the Budget Act of 2011 (Chapter 33, Statutes of 2011), as follows:

• 6110-150-0001 - American Indian Early Childhood Education- Pre-K to 4

• 6110-198-0001 - California School Age Families Education (Cal-SAFE)

• 6110-240-0001(2) - Advanced Placement Fee Reimbursement

• 6110-243-0001 - Pupil Retention Block Grant (PRBG)

• 6110-246-0001 - Targeted Instructional Improvement Block Grant (TIIBG)

• 6110-247-0001 - School and Library Improvement Block Grant (SLIBG)

Warrants will be mailed to each county treasurer approximately three weeks from the date of this Notice. For standardized account code structure coding, use Resource Code 0000, Unrestricted, and Revenue Object Code 8590, All Other State Revenue.

The county superintendents of schools were notified of this apportionment by e-mail which was sent to their CDEfisc e-mail addresses. The California Department of Education (CDE) requested that the e-mail be forwarded to all school districts and charter schools in the county, and included the links to this letter and the apportionment schedules which are posted on the CDE Web pages at http://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/ca/consolidations559.asp.

California *Education Code (EC)* Section 42605 authorizes complete flexibility by a school district, county office of education, and charter school in the use of funds appropriated in the state budget for fiscal years 2008-09 through 2014-15 for numerous budget items, including the funds formerly restricted to the programs included in this apportionment. School districts, county offices of education, and charter schools may now use the funds formerly restricted to these programs for any educational purpose. The funds are therefore unrestricted and should be accounted for as such. With the exception(s) noted below, program and funding requirements as otherwise provided in statute, regulation, and budget act provisional language associated with the funding are not in effect. *EC* Section 42605 (e) provides an exception with respect to Cal-SAFE child care. If a school district or county office of education operates the child care component of the Cal-SAFE program, they must comply with paragraphs (5) and (6) of subdivision (c) of *EC* Section 54746 regarding the health, safety, and program quality requirements for Cal-SAFE child care and development centers.

Each local educational agency's (LEA's) entitlement to 2011-12 funds from each flexible program was calculated based on the same relative proportion of funds that each LEA received in the base year of funding; this amount was then reduced to reflect the funding decrease enacted in Control Section 12.42 of the Budget Act of 2011. Pursuant to the provisions of *EC* Section 14401.1, payments for the flexed programs are to be made in twelve installments beginning in July and ending in June. Under the new "5-5-9" schedule, five percent of the annual entitlement is to be allocated in each of July and August and nine percent in each month thereafter through the following June. School districts, county offices of education, and charter schools may now use the funds formerly restricted to these programs for any educational purpose. The funds are therefore unrestricted and should be accounted for as such. With the exception noted below, program and funding requirements as otherwise provided in statute, regulation, and budget act provisional language associated with the funding are not in effect. *EC* Section 42605(e) provides an exception with respect to NBPTS funding for teacher awards. This provision requires a school district or county office of education to continue distributing funds to teachers who were in the Incentive Program prior to April 2009 until the teacher has received his or her full award. Funds that are not needed for this purpose are flexible.

Each local educational agency's (LEA's) entitlement to 2011-12 funds from each flexible program was calculated based on the same relative proportion of funds that each LEA received in the base year of funding; this amount was then reduced to reflect the funding decrease enacted in Control Section 12.42 of the Budget Act of 2011. Charter Schools that receive funding through the Charter School Categorical Block Grant (CSCBG) are eligible to receive separate funding for the programs included in this apportionment because in lieu funding for these programs is not provided through the CSCBG. Direct funded non-conversion charter schools that were new in 2008-09, however, will not be receiving funds in this apportionment. Instead, for the 2011-12 to the 2014-15 fiscal years, inclusive, they will receive a Supplemental Categorical Block Grant (SCBG) payment pursuant to EC Section 42606. The SCBG is equal to \$127 per unit of charter school average daily attendance as determined at the current year second principal apportionment and provides in lieu funding for a variety of categorical programs not included in the CSCBG, including the programs in this apportionment. Pursuant to EC Section 42606(2) in lieu of the SCBG, a school district shall provide new conversion charter schools that commenced operations within the district during or after the fiscal year 2008-09, \$127 dollars per unit of charter school average daily attendance as determined at the current year principal apportionment or a negotiated alternative funding rate.
