Re: Direct Funded Charter School Retirement Reporting

Memorandum for Fiscal Year 2012-13

The purpose of this bulletin is to remind all Direct Funded Charter Schools to submit their Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)ⁱ and fees for Retirement Processing Services to the Santa Clara County Office of Education on or before July 1, 2012. The MOU and the 2012-13 fees are required for all Direct Funded Charter Schools who offer CalSTRS or CalPERS retirement to their employees and are not to be confused with other administrative fees that are charged by your authorizing agency.

Background Information:

California State Teachers Retirement System (CalSTRS) changed the reporting requirements for Direct Funded Charter Schools (Charter School). Charter Schools must be assigned their own unique CalSTRS identification number (5 digits) and retirement data must be reported using this 5 digit number. The practice in Santa Clara County Office of Education (SCCOE) has been to blend the retirement data of the Charter School with that of the sponsoring district and report the blended data to CalSTRS. This practice is no longer allowable. At this time there is no option for reporting directly to CalSTRS. In an effort to help clarify which governmental plans are eligible for the special tax rules, the Internal Revenue Service is in the process of developing proposed regulations to define the term "governmental plan' under Internal Revenue Code Section 414(d) and has issued an advance notice of the proposed rulemaking to solicit feedback. It is expected that the proposed regulations are likely to list multiple facts and circumstances tests as the means to determine whether an entity is an agency or an instrumentality of a state or political subdivision and thus eligible to have its employees participate in a governmental plan.

Several Bulletinsⁱⁱ have been distributed to notify the Charter Schools of the changes and the requirements in addition to the fee structure that will be required for fiscal year 2012-13 and I have reference them below for your information. Services to be	provided by the Superintend	ent				

- 1. The Superintendent agrees to process STRS reporting for the Charter.
- 2. The Superintendent will serve as the contact agency in working with STRS in resolving problems and answering questions related to reporting and processing of retirement information.
- 3. The Superintendent will notify the Charter of retirement exceptions and recommendations of possible resolutions.
- 4. The Superintendent agrees to provide the Charter training (within Santa Clara County) and information necessary for completion of required reporting.
- 5. The Charter staff will be included in all workshops provided to School Districts for ongoing training and meetings related to STRS retirement.
- 6. The Superintendent agrees to assist in tracking Charter employee earnings and hours for mandatory membership under California Government Code Section 20305 and California Education Code Sections 22500 through 22504.
- 7. The Superintendent will assist the Charter payroll representative in preparing appropriate entries for past reporting that was not processed prior to the effect date of this agreement.

Responsibilities of the Charter

- 1. The Charter agrees to provide files of the required retirement and payroll information necessary for timely completion and transmittal of STRS information.
- 2. The Charter agrees to provide all the payroll/retirement reporting file data and reports by the due dates established by the Superintendent to meet all retirement reporting schedules established by STRS.
- 3. The Charter shall maintain all payroll records for its employees and furnish the Superintendent a copy upon request.
- 4. The Charter will designate one of its employees to serve as the contact person between the Charter and the Superintendent for matters related to regular reporting and processing of retirement information.

5. The Charter authorizes the Superintendent to deduct the full amount of the retirement contributions for both the employer and employee amounts from the monthly apportionment amounts. In the event that apportionments are not scheduled to be received for the month, the Charter shall submit to the Superintendent the full amount of the retirement contributions that include both the employer and employee amounts within two business days after the close of payroll.

Superintendent's Fee and Payment Thereof

- 1. The Charter agrees to pay the Superintendent for the services under this Agreement as follows:
 - \$2,000 per year to be paid upon signing and submission of the MOU.(On or before July of every year)
 - Processing fee of \$125 for each retirement data file submitted that is not acceptable and has to be replaced and reprocessed. These fees shall be assessed monthly and payable upon demand.
- 2. The Charter agrees to reimburse the Superintendent for any penalties and/or other levies assessed by STRS that were caused by acts of the Charter.
- 3. These service fees will be reviewed annually and published with the Santa Clara County Office of Education contracted Services Fee Schedule.
