The purpose of this e-mail is to notify you that the California Department of Education (CDE) has sent several apportionments to the State Controller's Office for payment.

Third Apportionment, Title III – LEP, Fiscal Year 2011–12

This apportionment, in the amount of \$39,988,292, is made from federal funds provided to the state under Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, in support of grants awarded to eligible local educational agencies for supplementary programs and services to Limited English Proficient students.

Seventh Apportionment, Title III – LEP, Fiscal Year 2010–11

This apportionment, in the amount of \$3,530,943, is made from federal funds provided to the state under Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, in support of grants awarded to eligible local educational agencies for supplementary programs and services to Limited English Proficient students.

Seventh Apportionment, Title I, Part D, Subpart 2, Fiscal Year 2010–11

This apportionment, in the amount of \$1,370,735, is made from federal funds provided by Schedule (4) of Item 6110-134-0890 of the Budget Act of 2010 (Chapter 712, Statutes of 2010) in support of Title I, Part D, Subpart 2, Neglected, Delinquent, and At-Risk Youth, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.

Local educational agencies (LEAs) included in this apportionment filed the 2010–11 Consolidated Application, have a State Board of Education approved LEA Plan, and reported a cash balance in the Cash Management Data Collection system, by April 30, 2012, that was less than 25 percent of their Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 entitlement amount.

Third Apportionment, Title I, Part D, Subpart 2, Fiscal Year 2011–12

This apportionment, in the amount of \$5,439,621, is made from federal funds provided by Schedule (4) of Item 6110-134-0890 of the Budget Act of 2011 (Chapter 33, Statutes of 2011) in support of Title I, Part D, Subpart 2, Neglected, Delinquent, and At-Risk Youth, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.

Local educational agencies (LEAs) included in this apportionment filed the 2011–12 Consolidated Application, have a State Board of Education approved LEA Plan, fully exhausted their 2010–11 entitlement, and reported a cash balance in the Cash Management Data Collection system, by April 30, 2012, that was less than 25 percent of their 2011–12 Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 entitlement amount.

This apportionment, in the amount of \$39,988,92, is made from federal funds provided to the state under Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB), in support of grants awarded to eligible local educational agencies (LEAs) for supplementary programs and services to Limited English Proficient (LEP) students. This apportionment provides payments to LEAs that reported their cash balance in April 2012 via the Cash Management Data Collection (CMDC) system, reported English Learner counts in the March 2010 R-30 Language Census Report, applied for the program on the 2011–12 Consolidated Application Part I, and have an approved LEA plan.

The CMDC was implemented by the California Department of Education (CDE) for Title III, LEP in order to adhere to the cash management requirements established in federal statute and regulations, and reduce the time elapsing between the receipt and disbursement of federal funds. The amount paid to an LEA in this apportionment depends on whether it had amounts unpaid from its 2010–11 Title III, LEP entitlement as of the April 2012 cash reporting period, and whether the unpaid balance was greater or less than the amount owed. If an LEA had no unpaid 2010–11 entitlement, its payment in this apportionment is equal to 25 percent of its 2011–12 entitlement for Title III, LEP minus its reported cash balance for Title III, LEP, with a maximum payment equal to the unpaid balance of its 2011–12 entitlement. If an LEA had an unpaid 2010–11 entitlement, the amount owed is equal to 25 percent of its 2010–11 entitlement for Title III, LEP minus its reported cash balance of the unpaid 2010–11 entitlement is being paid in a separate apportionment from 2010–11 funds. Any remaining amount owed after the 2010–11 payment is being paid in this apportionment from 2011–12 funds, with a maximum payment equal to the unpaid balance of the 2011–12 entitlement.

Each LEA's 2011–12 entitlement is equal to the number of English Learner students reported on the March 2010 R-30 Language Census Report, multiplied by a rate of \$111.15.

This apportionment, in the amount of \$1,370,735, is made from federal funds provided to the state under Title I, Part D, Subpart 2, Neglected, Delinquent, and At-Risk Youth, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB). Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 funds are apportioned to local educational agencies (LEAs) to provide programs that serve children and youth who are in locally operated correctional facilities or are attending community day programs for delinquent children and youth, and to provide assistance to children and youth who are neglected or at-risk of dropping out of school.

The amount paid to each LEA in this apportionment was determined based on information reported by the LEA in the Cash Management Data Collection (CMDC) system. The federal cash management threshold was then applied to the information that LEAs reported in April 2012. As such, each LEA's payment is equal to 25 percent of its Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 entitlement minus the reported cash balance as of April 30, 2012, subject to a maximum payment equal to the unpaid entitlement amount. The California Department of Education (CDE) implemented CMDC in October 2010 for Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 in order to reduce the time elapsing between the receipt and disbursement of federal funds, pursuant to the cash management requirements under federal statute and regulations. More details on the CMDC are posted at http://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/cm/.

This apportionment reflects payment of the 2010–11 entitlement to LEAs that applied for Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 funds on the 2010–11 Consolidated Application, Part 1, and that have a State Board of Education approved LEA Plan. Amounts paid in this apportionment are listed on the schedule of apportionment posted on the CDE Categorical Programs Web page at <u>http://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/ca/</u>.

NOTICE OF THE THIRD APPORTIONMENT FOR TITLE I, PART D, SUBPART 2, NEGLECTED, DELINQUENT, AND AT-RISK YOUTH NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001 FISCAL YEAR 2011–12

This apportionment, in the amount of \$5,439,621, is made from federal funds provided to the state under Title I, Part D, Subpart 2, Neglected, Delinquent, and At-Risk Youth, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB). Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 funds are apportioned to local educational agencies (LEAs) to provide programs that serve children and youth who are in locally operated correctional facilities or are attending community day programs for delinquent children and youth, and to provide assistance to children and youth who are neglected or at-risk of dropping out of school.

The amount paid to each LEA in this apportionment was determined based on information reported by the LEA in the Cash Management Data Collection (CMDC) system. The federal cash management threshold was then applied to the information that LEAs reported in April 2012. As such, each LEA's payment is equal to 25 percent of its Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 entitlement minus the reported cash balance as of April 30, 2012, subject to a maximum payment equal to the unpaid entitlement amount. The California Department of Education (CDE) implemented CMDC in October 2010 for Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 in order to reduce the time elapsing between the receipt and disbursement of federal funds, pursuant to the cash management requirements under federal statute and regulations. More details on the CMDC are posted at http://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/cm/.

This apportionment reflects the third payment of the 2011–12 entitlement to LEAs that applied for Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 funds on the 2011–12 Consolidated Application, Part 1, and that have a State Board of Education approved LEA Plan. Entitlement amounts have been adjusted for LEAs that failed to meet the federal maintenance of effort requirement applicable to 2011–12 funding, pursuant to Section 9521 of the ESEA and Title 34 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (*CFR*), Part 299, Subpart D, Section 299.5. Amounts paid in this apportionment are listed on the schedule of apportionment posted on the CDE Categorical Programs Web page at http://www.cde.ca.gov/fg/aa/ca/.

LEAs have the option to consolidate and use Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 funds with other federal, state, and local funds for schoolwide programs pursuant to Section 1114 of the ESEA and Title 34 of the *CFR*, Part 200, Subpart A, sections 200.25 through 200.29. Additional information such as program purposes, eligibility of schools, core elements, components, and benefits of a schoolwide program, is posted on the CDE Schoolwide Programs Web page at <u>http://www.cde.ca.gov/sp/sw/rt/</u>.

The United States Department of Education (ED) award number for this apportionment is S010A110005-11A. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance subprogram number is 84.010 (Title I Grants to LEAs). The funding is appropriated in Schedule (4) of Item 6110-134-0890 of the Budget Act of 2011 (Chapter 33, Statutes of 2011). The California sub-allocation (pass-through) number is Program Cost Account (PCA) 14357.

This grant award is subject to the provisions of Title I and Title IX of the ESEA, as applicable, and the General Education Provisions Act. This grant is also subject to the Title I regulations in Part 200 of Title 34 of the *CFR*, the General Provisions in 34 *CFR* Part 299, and the *Education Department General Administrative Regulations* in 34 *CFR* parts 76 (except for 76.650–76.662, Participation of Students Enrolled in Private Schools), 77, 80–82, 85, and 86. Regulations regarding Participation of Eligible Children in Private Schools are found in 34 *CFR* sections 200.62 through 200.67.

Under the federal Tydings Amendment, Section 421(b) of the General Education Provisions Act, 20 USC 1225(B), any funds that are not obligated at the end of the federal funding period, July 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012, shall remain available for obligation for an additional period of 12 months, through September 30, 2013.

Title 34 of the CFR, Section 80.21(i), requires that any interest earned by LEAs on federal dollars be returned to the ED promptly, but at least quarterly. LEAs may keep interest amounts up to \$100 per year for administrative expenses. LEAs should forward interest payments for remittance to the ED to:
