Re: Low Performing Student Block Grant

With the passage of AB 1808 in June 2018, Education Code 41570 was enacted. For the 2018–19 fiscal year, the sum of three hundred million dollars (\$300,000,000) has been appropriated from the General Fund to the Controller for transfer to Section A of the State School Fund for allocation by the Superintendent of Public Instruction in support of the Low Performing Student Block Grant (LPSBG). The California Department of Education (CDE) will allocate LPSBG funds during the 2018–19 fiscal year (FY) to eligible local educational agencies (LEAs), which include school districts, county offices of education (COEs), and charter schools that serve pupils identified as low-performing on state English language arts or mathematics assessments and who are not otherwise identified for supplemental grant funding under the Local Control Funding Formula or eligible for special education services.

- Each eligible LEA will receive an equal amount per pupil.
- Funds are available for expenditure or encumbrance through the 2020–21 FY.

As a condition of receiving LPSBG funds, an eligible school district, COE, or charter school is required to:

- Develop a plan describing how the funds will increase or improve evidence-based services for the
 pupils identified to accelerate increases in academic achievement, and how the effectiveness of
 services will be measured.
- The plan shall include information regarding how the services align with and are described in the school district's local control and accountability plan (LCAP), the county superintendent's LCAP, or the charter school's LCAP.

In order to ensure community and stakeholder input, the plan shall be discussed and adopted at a regularly scheduled meeting by the governing board of the school district, county board of education, or governing body of the charter school.

Districts may use the rate of \$1,976.02 to estimate funding until the CDE can post the entitlement schedule. Funding Description

The Low-Performing Students Block Grant is a state education funding initiative with the goal of providing grant funds to local educational agencies (LEAs) serving pupils identified as low-performing on state English language arts or mathematics assessments who are not otherwise identified for supplemental grant funding under the local control funding formula or eligible for special education services, as specified in Education Code (EC) Section 41570(d).

As a condition of apportionment, a school district, county office of education or charter school shall develop a plan describing how the funds will increase or improve evidence-based services for the identified pupils to accelerate increases in academic achievement, and how the effectiveness of the services will be measured. The plan shall be discussed

and adopted at a regularly scheduled meeting of the LEA's governing board.

LEAs shall report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction by March 1, 2019, regarding the adopted plan to use the funds, and by November 1, 2021, regarding the implementation of the plan, the strategies used and whether those strategies increased the

academic performance of the identified pupils.
