Re: Classified School Employee Summer Assistance Program (CESAP): Schedule of the Estimated State Match Funding for the School Year 2025-26

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Based on the estimated data report, the California Department of Education (CDE) has determined that a participating classified employee can expect to receive State Match Funding equal to approximately fifty-six cents (\$0.56) for each one dollar (\$1) that is elected to be withheld monthly in the 2025-26 school year. The CDE will make the required apportionment for the State Match Funding in August 2026.

Per the CDE's letter dated May 1, 2025, the schedule of the estimated amount of State Match Funding for each participating school district is available under "CESAP 2024 Funding Results" on the CDE website at:

**Classified School Employee Summer Assistance Program (CSESAP)  
 Program Funding Fiscal Year 2024-25 for School Year 2025-26  
 Important Dates**

<b>By June 1, 2025</b>	Districts must notify participating classified employees of the <b>estimated</b> amount of state match funding the employee can expect to receive for participating in the program.
<b>30 days after the start of the 2025-26 school year</b>	After receiving the notification from the district, a classified employee may withdraw his/her election to take part in the CSESAP or reduce the amount to be withheld from his/her paychecks, by notifying the district no later than 30 days after the start of the 2025-26 school year. The statute for the CSESAP does not define the date for the start of the school year. This will be decided by the districts.
<b>During the 2025-26 school year</b>	<p>The district will withhold the specified amount from an employee’s monthly paychecks (up to 10% of gross salary) that the employee writes down on the election form.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Employees who separate from employment during the 2025-26 school year:           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✚ Employees are not entitled to the matching funds if employees request to receive the funds withheld from their monthly paychecks during the school year at the time of separation.</li> <li>✚ Employees are entitled to the matching funds if employees do not request to immediately receive the funds withheld from their monthly paychecks during the school year.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>By July 31, 2026</b>	Districts must submit a web-based form to request payment from the CDE on or before July 31, 2026, for classified employee pay withheld. If the total amount requested by participating COE(s)/districts exceeds the appropriated amount available for the CSESAP, the CDE will apply a proration accordingly.
<b>During summer recess in 2026</b>	Districts must pay their classified employees the amounts withheld plus the state matching funds. The summer recess payments are to be made either in one or two payments, as specified by the classified employees at the time of enrollment.
